Next, we'd like to introduce two new associate editors: Judith Mariscal and Bill Tucker.

Judith Mariscal is professor at the Centro de Investigación y Docencia Económica (CIDE) in Mexico City, where she is director of the Telecommunications Research Program, Telecom-CIDE. Her research focuses on ICT regulatory and public policies. She has authored two books: *Unfinished Business: Telecommunications Reform in Mexico* and *Digital Poverty: Latin American and Caribbean Perspectives*, co-authored with Hernan Galperin. Judith is a member of the steering committee for DIRSI, a research network on ICT policy for Latin America, as well as for the Communications Research Conference Latin America. She is a social witness for Transparency International Chapter Mexico. Judith did her PhD at the Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs at the University of Texas in Austin.

William D. Tucker is an associate professor of Computer Science at the University of Western Cape (UWC) in South Africa. Bill is founder and director of the Bridging Application and Network Gaps (BANG) research group, which conducts applied research in information and communication technology for development. Among other work, BANG runs a telephony project for poor, deaf people in metropolitan Cape Town and a rural wireless mesh-network project in the remote rural Eastern Cape. Bill has the kind of interdisciplinary background that helps hold the ICTD community together: a BA degree in Sociology, Business Administration, and Computer Science from Trinity University in Texas, an MS in Computer Science from Arizona State University, and a PhD in Computer Science from the University of Cape Town.
